## **REFERENCE PAPER**

#### I SCOPE

The following are definitions and principles on the regulatory framework for the basic telecommunications services.

### <u>Definitions</u>

Users mean service consumers and service suppliers.

Essential facilities mean facilities of a public telecommunications transport network or service

- that
- (a) are exclusively or predominantly provided by a single or limited number of suppliers;
- (b) cannot feasibly be economically or technically substituted in order to provide a service.

<u>A major supplier</u> is a supplier which has the ability to materially affect the terms of participation (having regard to price and supply) in the relevant market for basic telecommunications services as a result of:

- (a) control over essential facilities; or
- (b) use of its position in the market.
- 1. Competitive safeguards
- 1.1 Prevention of anti-competitive practices in telecommunications

Appropriate measures shall be maintained for the purpose of preventing suppliers who, alone or together, are a major supplier from engaging in or continuing anti-competitive practices.

1.2 Safeguards

The anti-competitive practices referred to above shall include in particular:

- (a) engaging in anti-competitive cross-subsidization;
- (b) using information obtained from competitors with anti-competitive results; and
   (c) not making available to other services suppliers on a timely basis technical information about essential facilities and commercially relevant information which information are services.
- are necessary for them to provide services.
- 2. <u>Interconnection</u>
- 2.1 This section applies to linking with suppliers providing public telecommunications transport networks or services in order to allow the users of one supplier to communicate with users of another supplier and to access services provided by another supplier, where specific commitments are undertaken.

#### 2.2 Interconnection to be ensured

Interconnection with a major supplier will be ensured at any technically feasible point in the network. Such interconnection is provided.

- (a) under non-discriminatory terms, conditions (including technical standards and specifications) and rates and of a quality no less favourable than that provided for its own like services or for like services of non-affiliated service suppliers or for its subsidiaries or other affiliates;
- (b) in a timely fashion, on terms, conditions (including technical standards and specifications) and cost-oriented rates that are transparent, reasonable, having regard to economic feasibility, and sufficiently unbundled so that the supplier need not pay for network components or facilities that it does not require for the service to be provided; and
- (c) upon request, at points in addition to the network termination points offered to the majority of users, subject to charges that reflect the cost of construction of necessary additional facilities.

# 2.3 Public availability of the procedures for interconnection negotiations

The procedures applicable for interconnection to a major supplier will be made publicly available.

2.4 Transparency of interconnection arrangements

It is ensured that a major supplier will make publicly available either its interconnection agreements or a reference interconnection offer.

2.5 Interconnection: dispute settlement

A service supplier requesting interconnection with a major supplier will have recourse, either:

- (a) at any time; or
- atter a reasonable period of time which has been made publicly known to an independent domestic body, which may be a regulatory body as referred to in paragraph 5 below, to resolve disputes regarding appropriate terms, conditions and rates for interconnection within a reasonable period of time, to the extent that these have not been established previously.
- 3. Universal service

(q)

Any Party has the right to define the kind of universal service obligation it wishes to maintain. Such obligations will not be regarded as anti-competitively neutral manner and are administered in a transparent, non-discriminatory and competitively neutral manner and are not more burdensome than necessary for the kind of universal service defined by the Party.

4. Public availability of licensing criteria

Where a licence is required, the following will be made publicly available:

- (a) all the licensing criteria and the period of time normally required to reach a decision concerning an application for a licence; and
- (b) the terms and conditions of individual licenses.

The reasons for the denial of a licence will be made known to the applicant upon request.

### 5. Independent regulators

The regulatory body is separate from, and not accountable to, any supplier of basic telecommunications services. The decisions of and the procedures used by regulators shall be impartial with respect to all market participants.

# 6. Allocation and use of scarce resources

Any procedures for the allocation and use of scarce resources, including frequencies, numbers and rights of way, will be carried out in an objective, timely, transparent and nondiscriminatory manner. The current state of allocated frequency bands will be made publicly available, but detailed identification of frequencies allocated for specific government uses is not required.

# **ATTACHMENT 1 : REFERENCE PAPER**

### Scope

The following are definitions and principles on the regulatory framework for the basic telecommunications services.

# **Definitions**

Users mean service consumers and service suppliers.

Essential facilities mean facilities of a public telecommunications transport network or service that

- (a) are exclusively or predominantly provided by a single or limited number of suppliers; and
- (b) cannot feasibly be economically or technically substituted in order to provide a service.

<u>A major supplier</u> is a supplier which has the ability to materially affect the terms of participation (having regard to price and supply) in the relevant market for basic telecommunications services as a result of:

- (a) control over essential facilities; or
- (b) use of its position in the market.
- 1. <u>Competitive safeguards</u>
- 1.1 Prevention of anti-competitive practices in telecommunications

Appropriate measures shall be maintained for the purpose of preventing suppliers who, alone or together, are a major supplier from engaging in or continuing anti-competitive practices.

1.2 <u>Safeguards</u>

The anti-competitive practices referred to above shall include in particular:

- (a) engaging in anti-competitive cross-subsidization;
- (b) using information obtained from competitors with anti-competitive results; and
- (c) not making available to other services suppliers on a timely basis technical information about essential facilities and commercially relevant information which are necessary for them to provide services.

# 2. <u>Interconnection</u>

2.1 This section applies to linking with suppliers providing public telecommunications transport networks or services in order to allow the users of one supplier to communicate with users of another supplier and to access services provided by another supplier, where specific commitments are undertaken.

# 2.2 Interconnection to be ensured

Interconnection with a major supplier will be ensured at any technically feasible point in the network. Such interconnection is provided.

- under non-discriminatory terms, conditions (including technical standards and specifications) and rates and of a quality no less favourable than that provided for its own like services or for like services of non-affiliated service suppliers or for its subsidiaries or other affiliates;
- (b) in a timely fashion, on terms, conditions (including technical standards and specifications) and cost-oriented rates that are transparent, reasonable, having regard to economic feasibility, and sufficiently unbundled so that the supplier need not pay for network components or facilities that it does not require for the service to be provided; and
- (c) upon request, at points in addition to the network termination points offered to the majority of users, subject to charges that reflect the cost of construction of necessary additional facilities.

#### 2.3 <u>Public availability of the procedures for interconnection negotiations</u>

The procedures applicable for interconnection to a major supplier will be made publicly available.

#### 2.4 <u>Transparency of interconnection arrangements</u>

It is ensured that a major supplier will make publicly available either its interconnection agreements or a reference interconnection offer.

#### 2.5 Interconnection: dispute settlement

A service supplier requesting interconnection with a major supplier will have recourse, either:

- (a) at any time or
- (b) after a reasonable period of time which has been made publicly known

to an independent domestic body, which may be a regulatory body as referred to in paragraph 5 below, to resolve disputes regarding appropriate terms, conditions and rates for interconnection within a reasonable period of time, to the extent that these have not been established previously.

### 3. <u>Universal service</u>

Either Party has the right to define the kind of universal service obligation it wishes to maintain. Such obligations will not be regarded as anti-competitive *per se*, provided they are administered in a transparent, non-discriminatory and competitively neutral manner and are not more burdensome than necessary for the kind of universal service defined by the Party.

# 4. <u>Public availability of licensing criteria</u>

Where a licence is required, the following will be made publicly available:

- (a) all the licensing criteria and the period of time normally required to reach a decision concerning an application for a licence; and
- (b) the terms and conditions of individual licences.

The reasons for the denial of a licence will be made known to the applicant upon request.

# 5. <u>Independent regulators</u>

The regulatory body is separate from, and not accountable to, any supplier of basic telecommunications services. The decisions of and the procedures used by regulators shall be impartial with respect to all market participants.

# 6. <u>Allocation and use of scarce resources</u>

Any procedures for the allocation and use of scarce resources, including frequencies, numbers and rights of way, will be carried out in an objective, timely, transparent and nondiscriminatory manner. The current state of allocated frequency bands will be made publicly available, but detailed identification of frequencies allocated for specific government uses is not required.

# **ATTACHMENT 2 : EDUCATIONAL SERVICES**

1. The types of higher education institutions are as follows:

- a) Junior Colleges (excluding Polytechnic Colleges): higher education institutions which offer a two to three year curriculum and confer an associate degree, in accordance with the *Higher Education Act*.
- b) Universities: higher education institutions which offer a four to six year curriculum and confer a bachelor's degree, in accordance with the *Higher Education Act*.
- c) Industrial Universities: higher education institutions which offer education on the knowledge and skills needed for an industrial society, and confer a bachelor's degree, in accordance with the *Higher Education Act*.
- d) Technology Colleges: higher education institutions, which offer a two year curriculum to train expert manpower, and confer associate degrees and bachelor's degrees, in accordance with the *Higher Education Act*.
- e) Intra-company Universities: higher education institutions which are established and operated by employers to educate employees, and confer degrees or diplomas equivalent to those of Junior Colleges or Universities, in accordance with the *Lifelong Education Act*.
- 2. The types of adult education institution are as follows:
  - a) Hag-won (private teaching institutes for adults) are private education facilities that provide tutoring services on the following subjects related to lifelong or vocational education to ten people or more for a period of 30 days or longer in accordance with the Establishment and Operation of Private Teaching Institute and Extracurricular Lessons Act. Excluded are schools, libraries, museums, workplace facilities that provide education services to the employees, lifelong education facilities in accordance with the Lifelong Education Act, and driving schools.
    - Infrastructure industrial technology: machinery, automobile, metal, chemical and ceramic, electrics, telecommunications, electronics, shipbuilding, aviation, civil engineering, textile and apparel, mining resources, land development, agriculture and forestry, oceanic industry, energy, crafts, environment, transportation, safety management
    - (ii) Applied industrial technology: design, hair and cosmetic management, food and beverage, packaging, printing, photograph, piano tuning
    - (iii) Computer: telecommunications equipment, software, data processing, the Internet, computer, games

- (iv) Nursing assistant: nursing assistant
- (v) Culture and tourism: publishing, imaging and recording, film, broadcasting, character products, tourism
- (vi) International: foreign languages for adults, translation, interpretation
- (vii) Management and office work: finance, insurance, distribution, real estate, secretary service, accounting, pen writing, bookkeeping, abacus, mental arithmetic, and speed-reading
- (viii) Humanities: public management, business management, accounting, statistics, public service examination
- (xi) Arts: traditional Korean music, traditional dance, calligraphy, music, painting, dance, speech, modelling, cartoon, baduk, theatre arts, flower arrangement, floral art and crafts.
- b) Lifelong education facilities are the facilities which have been approved by, registered with or notified to the Ministry of Education in accordance with the *Lifelong Education Act*. Lifelong adult education facilities refer to lifelong education facilities annexed to workplaces, non-governmental organizations, schools, and media organizations, and lifelong education facilities related to the development of knowledge and human resources, all of which are established for adults.

# **ATTACHMENT 3 : MARITIME TRANSPORT SERVICES**

1. International Shipping, 3.b):

"Other forms of commercial presence for the supply of international maritime transport services" means the ability for international maritime transport service suppliers of other Members to establish branches and to undertake activities concerned for the supply to their customers of maritime transport services.

2. Maritime Cargo Handling Services:

Activities exercised by stevedore companies, including terminal operators, but not including the direct activities of dockers, when this workforce is organized independently of the stevedoring or terminal companies. The activities covered include the organization and supervision of:

- the loading/discharging of cargo to/from a ship;
- the lashing/unlashing of cargo; and
- the reception/delivery and safekeeping of cargoes before shipment or after discharge.
- 3. Customs Clearance Services:

Activities consisting in carrying out on behalf of another party customs formalities concerning import, export or through transport of cargoes, whether this service is the main activity of the service supplier or a usual complement of its main activity.

4. Container Station and Depot Services:

Activities consisting in storing containers in port areas with a view to their stuffing/stripping, repairing and making them available for shipments.

5. Maritime Agency Services:

Activities consisting in representing, within a given geographical area, as an agent, the business interests of one or more shipping lines or shipping companies, for the following purposes:

- Marketing and sales of maritime transport and related services, from quotation to invoicing, and issuance of bills of lading on behalf of the companies; acquisition and resale of the necessary related services, preparation of documentation, and provision of business information; or
- Acting on behalf of the companies organizing the call of the ship or taking over cargoes when required.
- 6. Maritime Freight Forwarding Services:

Activities consisting of organizing and monitoring shipment operations on behalf of shippers, through the acquisition of maritime transport and related services, preparation of documentation and provision of business information.

- 7. Tally, Measuring and Survey Services:
  - Tally services: Activities consisting of calculating the number of cargoes or verifying the delivery and the receipt when loading and unloading.
  - Measuring services: Activities consisting of calculating or verifying the volume or weight of cargoes when loading and unloading.
  - Survey services: Activities consisting of the verification, inspection and survey related with shipped cargoes and vessels (including barges).
